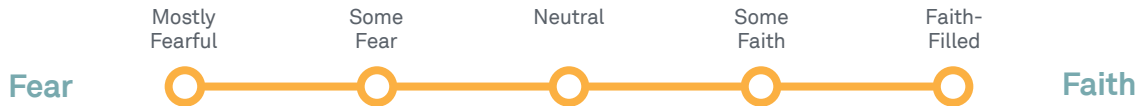


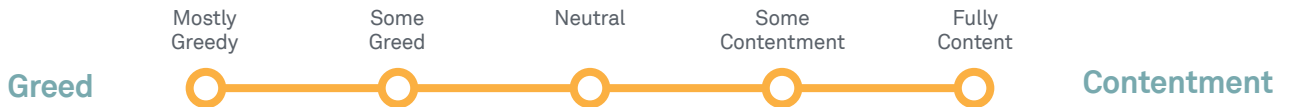
Outcomes of Biblical Financial Advice

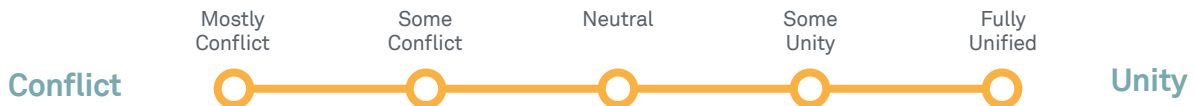
Self-Assessment

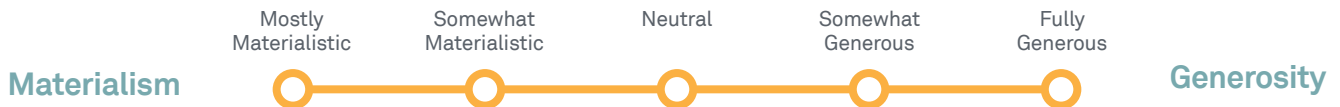

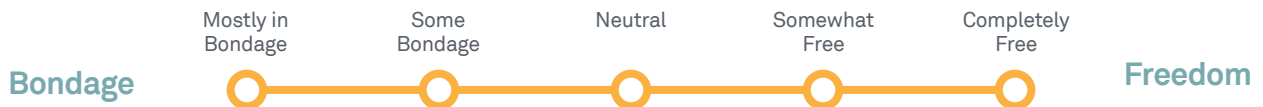
